Professional Credentials

In 2006, I was awarded post-doctoral respecialization certification in Clinical Psychology from the University of Hawaii at Manoa. In 2008, I fulfilled post-doctoral clinical requirements as a Clinical Psychologist with the State of Hawaii Department of Education. In the Spring of 2009, I was awarded licensure to practice as a Clinical Psychologist in the State of Hawaii (PSY 1111), and in the Fall of 2009 I began a private practice.

Professional Experience

I have been employed as a clinical psychologist in private practice since 2009.

From 2007 to 2015, I was employed by the State of Hawaii Department of Education as a Clinical Psychologist VI. This role allowed me to provide direct support to students and schools including clinical assessment, consultation, and counseling services. I also provided supervision and programmatic assistance to master's level behavioral health clinicians and other personnel providing mental health services to students. In all, I conferred services to schools comprising the Kalani and Kaiser Complexes of Honolulu District and direct clinical supervision to over 10 master's level clinicians (Behavioral Health Specialists).

As a Clinical Psychologist Intern (2004-06), I provided services to the Hawaii State Departments of Education and Health. Through the Department of Education, I offered

School-Based Behavioral Health (SBBH) services to students identified as disabled or impaired through their Individual Educational Plans (IEP). With the Department of Health, I furnished intensive in-home therapy for children and adolescents.

I was employed by Pacific Resources for Education and Learning (PREL) from 1997-2007 and served as the Director of Evaluation Training and Principal Investigator of 900K in grants from the National Science Foundation (NSF).

In 2000, I was elected co-chair of the American Evaluation Association's International and Cross-Cultural Evaluation group, and served on its International Committee. I have also served as a reviewer for the *American Journal of Evaluation*, *Evaluation and Program Planning*, and the *Canadian Journal of Program Evaluation*.

Early after completion of my doctorate in 1994, I moved to Hawaii and conducted educational program evaluation for the University of Hawaii, Office of the Chancellor for Community Colleges and Leeward Community College (1994 to 1997).

As a clinical and research psychologist, I am interested in promoting the well-being of those with mental illness, both as a clinician and as a proponent of national, state, county, and community mental health reform. I seek to strengthen and broaden my expertise in these interests by building upon experience gained as a clinical psychologist and as a researcher involved in psychotherapy outcome research.
